<p><b>Description</b></p>	<p>This is a large growing, pale-barked, deciduous tree with classic large green maple leaves that turn a brilliant yellow to orange and red in autumn. This tree is native to the eastern states of North America. It produces beautiful autumnal foliage colour and is best known for being the primary source of maple syrup.</p>
